

# Billing Integration | Juris

#### **Required Modules**

 The matter export to PaperCut use the Validation Export Utility, which should be located in the Juris install directory. There is no charge for this utility.

### **Data Export From Juris (To Papercut)**

- Data is exported using the Validation Export Utility. This process is manual.
- There is an option for a direct SQL connection to the Juris database. If this connection is configured, client/ matter information is automatically imported to Juris.

#### **Data Import To Juris (From Papercut)**

- Papercut will automatically export a CSV file to a Windows folder on a scheduled basis.
- The importing of data (cost recovery) into Juris is always manual.
- The transaction import uses the standard Expense Entry import tool built into Juris.

#### **Vendor Support**

 The customer does not need to schedule time with Juris vendor support. ACDI is very familiar with working with Juris.

## Scheduling

- If the customer chooses to manually export data from Juris, then the Juris integration can typically take place on the same day as the PaperCut installation.
- If the customer chooses the SQL database connection for client/matter import then time estimates need to be increased to accommodate working with the database administrator.
- If the customer is working with a Managed Service/I9/ hk Provider (MSP), please allocate extra time for the MSP to set up the correct permissions for database access.



### **Export Options - Client/Matter Information**

- Client/Matter data can be manually exported using the Validation Export Utility.
- Juris also supports a direct SQL connection, which automates the exporting of data to PaperCut

#### Frequency

# Export Options -Transactional/Cost Information

- Papercut will automatically export a CSV file to a Windows folder on a scheduled basis.
- The importing of data (cost recovery) into Juris is always manual.
- The transaction import uses the standard Expense Entry import tool built into Juris.

### Frequency

• Typically once a month, but adjustable
